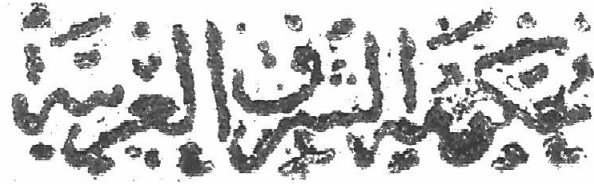


Forgeries of 1924 (January) Single line overprint.

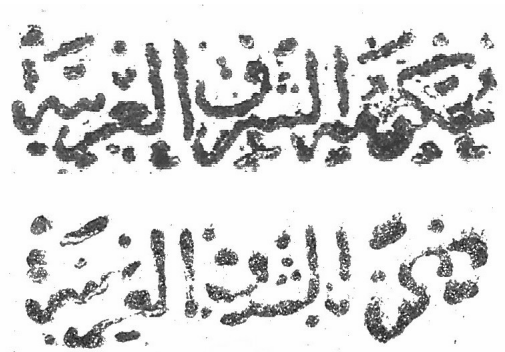


Genuine overprint

The genuine overprint was used on the 1924 (January) issue which was subsequently overprinted to produce the King Hussein visit commemorative issue.

This document covers forgeries of this single line overprint used either alone or with forgeries of the King Hussein overprint.

Forgery type 1

Plate size	Not known
Plate construction	Probably stereotype
Different settings	Not known.

This forgery is a very crude and simple attempt to mimic the genuine overprint. As can be seen from the illustration above, there is a considerable lack of detail. This forgery is not difficult to identify using the illustration above.

Example of type 1 overprint

This forgery has only be seen on a King Hussein visit forgery and could even be part of a single overprint plate used on that issue.

Forgery type 2

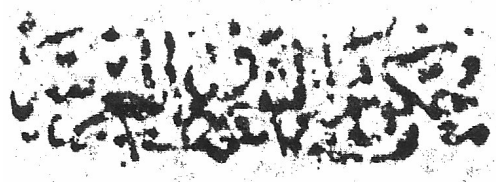


Plate size	Not applicable
Plate construction	Not applicable
Different settings	Not known.

This overprint is a modern xerography forgery and as such is likely to match exactly one of the genuine overprint positions.

Seen as an inverted overprint, but on a ½p in the rose shade not used for genuine stamps of this 1924 issue.
